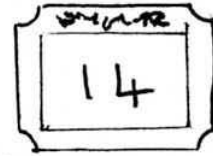
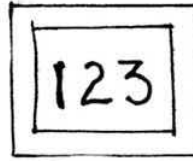


Every railway bridge has a number. These are usually on a cast iron plate which is screwed to the wall at the side of the bridge so that it can be seen by the on-coming train.
