BELLEROPHON at Crewe Grand Junction 150 Celebrations.

It is now almost certain that *Bellerophon* will be spending nearly one month at Crewe, leaving Haworth on Monday July 13th and returning on Friday August 7th.

The exhibition is not in Crewe B.R. works but on a new site adjacent to the West Coast main line.

The loco is expected to be in steam on nine occasions giving rides on a 200 metre demonstration track.

We may also operate a sales stand throughout.

Haydock Foundry Trip

This visit took place on Sunday 26th April. It was a revival, albeit on a small scale, of an important annual event in the Haydock area around the turn of the century. In those days, when there was no annual holiday, a day trip was organised for the colliery employees, their wives and families. Most of the population of Haydock, boarded carriages which had been brought to the colliery companies sidings, and set off for Blackpool. In the early years, the colliery engines, among them *Bellerophon*, had hauled them all the way, but in later years went only to the main line at Earlstown. The outings had been discontinued before the outbreak of the first World War.

For our trip, a 53 seat motor coach had been booked. Many of the people had not met for years, so much of the journey was spent in trying to remember faces and catching up with what had been happening over the years. We arrived in Oxenhope, southern terminus of the Worth Valley Railway soon after noon in beautiful Spring sunshine. The train was not due until one, so we split up in search of refreshment.

We got back in time to see *Bellerophon* drawing into the station with our train. Seats had been reserved for us and the engine carried a special headboard so that all and sundry knew it was the "Haydock Foundry Trip". After a few blasts on *Bellerophon's* whistle we moved off, along the line to Keighley, passing the beautifully restored stations. A real trip down memory lane for those who remember things like gas lamps, milk churns and porters with waistcoats and watchchains.

At Keighley we disembarked while *Bellerophon* took on water and ran round the train. There was much clicking of cameras and among other things, a donation of £100 from the party was accepted by Mr. Michael Cope, on behalf of the Vintage Carriages Trust. Many people had also taken the opportunity to buy copies of Vernon Smallwood's new book about *Bellerophon*, which was on sale at Keighley Station.

A lot of people got out at Haworth during the return journey, some to see the locomotive sheds, while others visited the village and Bronte Museum. It was very pleasant just walking along the line-side footpaths and then riding back on the train. It was a splendid day out, and our thanks must go to all who made it possible; the people at Haydock who organised the trip, the Worth Valley Railway and Vintage Carriages Trust, and the men who made *Bellerophon* 113 years ago and kept her running. Last but not least, Vernon Smallwood, who got the restoration under way.

COACH RESTORATION REPORTS

NINE-COMPARTMENT METROPOLITAN COACH

The painting of the exterior of this coach is now complete and finished to a very high standard. The London Transport transfers are yet to be obtained but it is hoped that they will be in position on the sides before the end of 1987.

The new roof covering has now stretched smooth and looks very neat and tidy. We have in stock some flame retardant paint which we will put onto the covering to protect it from sparks emitted from the engines.

Internally one compartment remains to be restored out of the nine and there is a relatively small amount to do in some of the other compartments.

The coach was transferred from the carriage workshop to the Exhibition Shed at Oxenhope several months ago where it has remained except when removed for a TV filming job.

CHATHAM COACH

This coach has been available for service but requires attention to the external woodwork and paintwork. It is unlikely that any significant amount of work will be carried out until space can be made available in the carriage workshop.

METROPOLITAN BRAKE COACH

The Metropolitan Brake requires attention to the external woodwork but at present is out of traffic due to weak buffer beams and corroded strengthening structures behind them. This is likely to be expensive to repair and we are currently investigating various methods to enable the vehicle to be returned to service.

MS&L 4-WHEEL COACH

The repaint in Great Central livery is a joy but have you seen the interior? It is now a focal point for evening railbus tours. The first class compartment is the height of luxury. The first (uprated second) is comfortable but much less opulent. The two thirds are very spartan. Have a look next time you visit Oxenhope Exhibition Shed. The only 1987 Transport Trust commendation was awarded to this coach for its restoration.

We would like to install at least one more oil carriage lamp on this coach. One such lamp is now in position on the coach, this is virtually identical to an original MS&L carriage lamp in the possession of the Railway Society of the (former) Doncaster Grammar School but very clearly labelled 'BR'. CHESHAM BRANCH CENTENARY

As briefly reported in the last News, London Transport have approached the VCT for inclusion in the Celebrations of the Chesham Branch Centenary in 1989. We have agreed in principle and on 6th June John Downs and Michael Cope met Mr. Greenslade, Divisional Operations Manager of the Metropolitan and Jubilee Lines and Mr. Patterson, whose responsibilities include operation of the Neasden Depot. They were shown the three Metropolitan Coaches and the South Eastern and Chatham Coach. We now hope to discuss further a package of two or more of the four coaches going to London in 1989.

LOCOMOTIVE REPORTS

BELLEROPHON

During the past 3 months *Bellerophon* has worked 6 Sunday VCT trains which I believe, were quite well patronised. *Bellerophon* coped quite well with 3 coaches but could not catch up on the lost time or late running to keep to a tightly scheduled timetable. If you run into Keighley late then it takes all the spare time filling the well tanks up as this is quite a slow process waiting for the three tanks balancing themselves out.

So most Sundays it ran with 2 coaches and timewise coped a little better.

Sunday April 26th saw the 'Haydock Foundry Trip' descend on Haworth, which is hoped to become an annual event. The chime whistle fitted for the day appears to have caused a few comments, but I can assure you it was only fitted because the crews could not find the original one where I had left it.

The beginning of April saw Bellerophon starring in a new John Huntley victorian video.

Bellerophon's next steaming dates are to be in July at Crewe's 150th Anniversary Celebration and later, Saturday evenings on the KWVR as advertised in this newsletter.

INGROW CARRIAGE SHED

We are pleased to be able to report that we have received confirmation of the grant from the Museums Galleries Commission for the first stage of the Carriage Shed at Ingrow. The grant is for £4350 being 50% of the £8700 required for the first stage which includes surveying and laying the foundations. The first payment to the architect for arrangement of the various requirements for the construction of the shed has been made. Test borings have been carried out and arrangements are being made to finalise details of the plans including access and drainage for future toilet facilities. The finance required for this first stage should be available from the present healthy balance of funds. We now need to organise fundraising towards the second and much more expensive stage, the construction of the framework and cladding.

We anticipate that the first visible signs of progress with the laying of the foundations will help to increase funds to a project which is well under way. We need to increase our fund raising activity and any new ideas will be most welcome. Any suggestions on what may be more eyecatching than the presend Shed Appeal leaflet — Have we any marketing men (or women) in our organisation who are able to sell our product?

If you have been considering sending a donation to the appeal but have just not got round to it PLEASE DO SO NOW! Your donation *WILL* safeguard the future of our important collection of historic coaches and locomotives. Any donation over £5 can be covenanted if you pay U.K. Income Tax at no extra cost to yourself. Arrangements can be made with the Covenant Treasurer to pay monthly for four years instead of four annual payments. If anyone was able to donate say just £2 per month by standing order they would be donating £96 over four years but VCT would receive over £140 by reclaiming the tax. Obviously any larger amounts are welcome.


